
Introducing teachers and students to new technology and cutting-edge curriculum helps prepare them to meet the challenges of an ever-changing global economy.

At the forefront of our work at the KCI is the instructional design of our programs, much of which focuses on education's **Social and Emotional Learning** (SEL) component. SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions. It's an integral part of education and human development, and enhances students' educational experience while promoting equitable outcomes for all. MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

We are excited to celebrate 22 years of delivering impactful professional learning programs for educators in 2022! California schools and districts are finally starting to return to a "new normal" that we predicted last year. In response to this ever-changing landscape, our state certificate programs continue to inspire educators and we remain an innovative workshop provider that responds to the most relevant challenges in education today.

When planning for the 2022-2023 school year, we focused on trending needs in the state of California. Our currently scheduled fall and winter workshops cover important topics such as humanizing mathematics, cybersecurity, teacher retention strategies, computer science, and English language development. These efforts continue to ensure that educators have what they need to support students with the most up-to-date and best-in-practice professional learning.

KCI has hosted over 67,200 hours of professional learning for California educators since 2000.

In July 2022, our MERIT Program took shape as KCl's first HyFlex professional learning program welcoming participants in both Northern and Southern California locations. Synchronous learning took place both online and in-person with both groups in attendance simultaneously. Helen Rike says it best: "Collaborative, Creative, Engaging Educational Professional Development. [These programs] reignite your passion to share learning experiences. Everything I learned I could use in a classroom. My students and my peers benefited from all I learned and shared. I was prepared and able to provide engaging activities both online and in person." In October 2022, the fourth cohort of KCl's popular Online and Blended IMPACT Program launched, supporting the efforts of many schools and districts to successfully implement online and blended learning. Additionally, KCl's STEAM Leadership Program embraced personal identity and cultural relevance this past summer while also diving deeply into STEAM integration best practices. Finally, our SPACE Program continues to attract the highest interest numbers and brings the best of design thinking, creativity, and innovation in maker education to K-12 educators in the Bay Area. Knowing the high priority of maker education K-12 settings, we plan to run another SPACE Program cohort set to launch in January 2023 geared to prepare learners for hands-on career opportunities emerging now and in the future.

As Nelson Mandela once said "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." Thank you for being a part of our efforts to be the change we hope to see in education.


