KCI MILESTONES 2022-2023

Major Events

Hyflex Learning Integration

This past year, we've successfully implemented Hyflex Learning across selected programs and workshops. This innovative approach offers both in-person and online real-time collaborative learning experiences.

Broadening KCI's Innovation Horizons

We expanded our offerings this year by integrating five new focus areas: Cybersecurity, Semiconductors, Assistive Technology, Artificial Intelligence, and Virtual Reality.

Teacher Retention Panel

In collaboration with the Learning Policy Institute, KCI hosted a compelling panel discussion in January 2023. Featuring Dr. Linda Darling-Hammond, CEO of the Learning Policy Institute, the event centered on the critical research and solutions surrounding teacher support and retention.

CUE Conference Participation

The KCI team attended the annual Center for Universal Education (CUE) conference. We also supported KCI instructors and ambassadors who presented and facilitated a hands-on makerspace activity for all conference participants.

Tech & Learning Summit

A landmark event hosted by KCI where EdTech leaders from across California convened. The summit emphasized the paramount importance of innovation and diversity in the evolving educational landscape.

Inaugural KClcon Event

A proud moment for KCI as we launched our first-ever KCI conference. Our distinguished alumni showcased groundbreaking practices and initiatives from their respective schools, districts, county offices, or organizations. The event's resonating theme was "Reaching Your Most Vulnerable Learners."

Grants

California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) Grant

Foothill College and the KCI partnered with SEMI Foundation and Ignited Education to create a pre-apprenticeship pathway for high school students in underserved communities to educate and engage them in the semiconductor industry. It is a \$500,000 grant over three years, funding one SPACE (Supporting Prototyping & Creativity in Education) cohort each year, with the first year completed in July 2023.

Invention, Inclusion, and Innovation (i3) Grant

The KCI worked with Foothill College instructors to integrate entrepreneurship into their existing curriculum. Instructors from the following departments were involved: Anthropology, Business, Chemistry, Graphic Arts, Middle College, Theater Arts, and Computer Science. It was a \$125,000 grant for one year.

CSforAll Grant

The KCI partnered with the Santa Clara County Office of Education, WestEd, and San Jose State University to bring computational thinking and culturally relevant instruction to 4th and 5th-grade mathematics students in four East Side San Jose school districts. The goal of the program is to make high-quality computer science an integral part of the educational experience of all K-12 students and teachers and to support student pathways to college and career success. It is a \$1,000,000 grant from the National Science Foundation over three years, and the partnership concluded its second year.



Current Sponsorships

Synopsys Outreach Foundation

Synopsys provided the KCI with \$38,160 to fund the STEAM Leadership Program. Their generous support provided 12 units and instructional materials to 23 educators from the Bay Area.

Adobe Software

Adobe ran a Leadership Summit at the KCI, where they brought in several instructors, food, and swag for more than 40 educators. At the end of the event, each educator received an Adobe Certificate Level 1 and 2.

In collaboration with Foothill College, we currently run the following state certificate programs for educators:



[maker] SPACE Program

Supporting Prototyping & Creativity in Education. Designed for current K-14 educators who are interested in pursuing a coordinating role in a makerspace and/or integrating a maker-mindset into their current instructional plan.



Online & Blended IMPACT Program

Integrating Modern Pedagogy & Adaptable Coursework through Technology. Designed for current K-14 educators who want to design interactive virtual learning experiences for their students.



MERIT Program

Making Education Relevant through Innovative Teaching. Designed for current K-14 educators seeking to sharpen their skills in the pedagogy and field practice of technology integration or leadership as Technology Integration Specialists.



STEAM Leadership Program

Designed for current K-14 educators who seek to infuse classroom instruction with STEAM principles and content while also empowering learners to identify their diverse skills across science, technology, engineering, art, and math.
