We're excited to celebrate 24 years of empowering California educators through our professional learning programs and looking forward to our 25th anniversary next year! A heartfelt thank you to our donors and partners for their invaluable support in helping us reach educators across our region and state. Here are some of the key milestones we've achieved during the 2023-2024 year.

Major Events

- Launched the **Silicon Valley Artificial Intelligence Project** (SVAIP) which included:
- An Al Summit
- Development of a new Artificial Intelligence Certificate Program (to be launched in Spring 2025)
- Piloted a groundbreaking Semiconductor Lesson Design series
- Hosted the oversubscribed California Educators
 Together Summit
- Completed and daily utilized a **new outdoor classroom** with furniture and technology
- Led this year's **California certification programs**, all with high enrollment (MERIT, STEAM, MakerSPACE, IDI / Innovative Digital Instruction)

- Held the KClcon Conference, featuring astronaut Dr. Yvonne Cagle as keynote speaker
- Introduced a new Virtual Reality Workshop series
- Partnered with instructor Ed Campos for the Al Plaiground series
- **Presented at key conferences**: CISC (Curricular & Improvement Support Conference), Fall CUE, Spring CUE, and the California STEAM Symposium
- Delivered professional development and newcomer PD at Seaside High School in Monterey
- Initiated strategic planning for the next 5 years

Grants

California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) Grant

Foothill College and the KCI partnered with SEMI Foundation and Ignited Education to create a pre-apprenticeship pathway for high school students in underserved communities to educate and engage them in the semiconductor industry. It is a \$500,000 grant over three years, and we completed year two in July 2024.

CSforAll Grant

The KCI partnered with the Santa Clara County Office of Education, WestEd, and San Jose State University to bring computational thinking and culturally relevant instruction to 4th and 5th-grade mathematics students in four East Side San Jose school districts. The goal of the program is to make high-quality computer science an integral part of the educational experience of all K-12 students and teachers, and to support student pathways to college and career success. It was a \$1,000,000 grant from the National Science Foundation over three years, and the Research Project Partnership grant will sunset in September 2024.

Current Sponsorships

- Synopsys Outreach Foundation gifted the KCI with \$25,000 to co-fund the STEAM Leadership Program. Their generous support allowed us to provide 12 units and instructional materials to 23 educators from the Bay Area.
- California Educators Together is a community of practice designed to provide educators, administrators, specialists, and state program leads with a common space to communicate, share strategies, and access resources.
- House Family Foundation donated to co-sponsor the STEAM Leadership Program and math workshops.

Laying the groundwork by fostering confidence, inspiring minds, and imparting new skills within our professional learning community is our goal. We revolutionize the way we teach and learn.





MERIT Program

STEAM Leadership Program
