MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The past year at the Krause Center for Innovation was truly transformative, and that transformation began with you. Your partnership didn't just support our work; it fueled a year of ignited curiosity, opened doors to equitable learning, and sparked vital innovation across our region. We are thrilled to share the incredible impact you helped create in 2024-2025.



2024–2025: What We Accomplished Together

- Professional Learning for Teachers: We delivered 23,904 hours of professional development to 1,123 educators across 93 unique districts that resulted in 85 community college certificates, focusing on project-based learning, educational technology integration, and culturally responsive pedagogy. In addition, we also launched our first-ever Summer Learning Pass, which was an outstanding success.
- Student Impact: Our programs in 2025 alone reached approximately 112,300 students through in-school partnerships, after-school programs, weekend workshops, and summer learning experiences. And this impact doesn't stop after one year!
- Signature Programs: KCI hosted 10 programs this year: AI Capstone x 4, STEAM Leadership x 2, SPACE x 2, IDI, and MERIT.
- Community Partnerships: We collaborated with Synopsys Outreach Foundation, RAFT, Silicon Valley Education Foundation, The Tech Interactive, Santa Clara County Office of Education, Foothill-De Anza Community College Foundation, the Foothill College Apprenticeship Department, and several Santa Clara, Monterey, and San Mateo school districts, strengthening pathways between classrooms, families, and industry.
- Research and Evaluation: Our internal evaluations showed improvements in teacher confidence in integrating technology into the classroom, and increases in student engagement in project-based units.
- Al Project Launch: KCl's new Silicon Valley Artificial Intelligence Project (SVAIP) is a five-year initiative empowering educators with the Al tools and guidance needed to prepare students for the future and create the nation's most advanced teaching workforce.

• Financial Stewardship: Thanks to your generosity, we raised \$1,628,002 in philanthropic support for the year, allowing us to maintain prudent budget oversight while investing in program quality and sustainability.

• Grants & Sponsorships:

- The Synopsys Outreach Foundation provided KCI with \$25K to fund the STEAM Leadership Program. Their generous support allowed 23 Bay Area educators the opportunity to earn 12 units and covered the cost of their instructional materials.
- The Al Education Project aiEDU is sponsoring the Rural and Indigenous Community Catalyst Program, providing KCI the opportunity to work with Soledad Unified School District and the Tachi Yokut Tribal Community to bring artifical intelligence literacy and best practices to their students.
- Google.org sponsored key activities in KCl's Silicon Valley Artificial Intelligence Project (SVAIP), including hosting two working sessions, the opportunity for 12 educators from each partner district to complete the Al Capstone program, up to 18 hours of districtwide professional development, and the implementation of an impact study for eight partner districts.
- KCI also received a no-cost extension for the California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) to complete the pre-apprenticeship grant program to raise awareness of the need for a large semiconductor workforce. Currently, the CAI grant also financially supports KCI's SPACE Program.





